Objectives for allocation of PPSG:

- To provide sustainable opportunities for all children to participate in physical activities during school playtimes.
- To ensure all children can access sporting events at a variety of locations throughout the year.
- To introduce new sports to actively encourage more pupils to take up sport at every level.
- To provide professional, specialist coaching in order to inspire and attract more children to attend extra curricular clubs at a sustained level and to upskill staff across the school.

The school gained the Gold School Games Mark for the second consecutive year. 100% of KS2 children have had the opportunity to participate in an inter-school competition. (participation statistics; 80% of KS2 pupils, 83% of SEND, 80% of PP, 60% girls, 89% boys). 75% of KS1 children have participated in an inter-school competition. On-going advice and support from specialist teachers and continued collaboration with other schools and clubs has enabled us to further develop links so pupils can take part in a wider range of activities. G&T pupils from Year 6 attended the Stars Academy held at Longcroft School. Two pupils received awards at the annual SSP ceremony including first place in the 'Performance in PE' award and runner up in 'Sports Personality of the Year' award.

Feedback from lunch time staff has shown an increase in organised participation and particular inclusion of SEND pupils. Feedback from pupils shows they appreciate this enhanced provision. The sessions delivered have become a bank of resources to be used in the future.
