Objectives for allocation of PPSG:

- To use P.E. as a means to engage children actively in other areas of the curriculum; particularly maths and English.
- To use feedback from the pupil voice to continue to improve the environment for playtimes/lunchtimes in order to have an impact on the level of physical activity.
- To ensure all children, including PP and SEND pupils, can access sporting events at a variety of locations throughout the year.
- To provide professional, specialist coaching in order to inspire and attract more children to attend extra curricular clubs at a sustained level with new sports introduced.

Both the table tennis table and play boat additions to the school have given substance and credence to the pupil voice. KS1 pupils are fully active at break times with the addition of the play boat. Their physical activity is regularly observed to incorporate immense imaginative play and language development opportunities.
