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Objectives for allocation of PPSG:

- To use P.E. as a means to engage children actively in other areas of the curriculum; particularly maths and English.
- To use feedback from the pupil voice to continue to improve the environment for playtimes/lunchtimes in order to have an impact on the level of physical activity.
- To ensure all children, including PP and SEND pupils, can access sporting events at a variety of locations throughout the year.
- To provide professional, specialist coaching in order to inspire and attract more children to attend extra curricular clubs at a sustained level with at least 2 new sports introduced.
