

Lockington C of E Primary School PE Sport Grant 2018/2019

Department for Education VISION for the Primary PE and Sport Premium:

ALL pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following OBJECTIVE: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (above) that will live well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for a whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

In our action plan below we have specified which of the above key indicators each action/priority is relates to. This helps the school to focus their actions and ensure the funding is used as the Department for Education intended.

Objectives for allocation of PSSG:

- To ensure that extra-curricular opportunities are accessible for all pupils, including SEND and PP pupils
- To give priority to the teaching and learning of swimming (above and beyond the NC requirements) by providing all KS2 pupils with specialist coaching sessions
- To ensure the safety and longevity of outdoor PE and play equipment to inspire physical activity
- To allow greater ownership and fitness tracking of personal targets by KS2 pupils
- To ensure that maximum numbers of pupils are accessing extra-curricular PE opportunities by extending provision and including coaching at lunchtimes
