## **School Strategic Plan**

Governors met last night and agreed the school strategic plan for this year, building upon some excellent attainment and progress outcomes in 2023, well above national and local outcomes (which we are unable to share due to the small size of our cohort). To summarise, our main foci will be, in line with our Christian Vision, "Let your light shine before others" (Matthew 5:16):

- Continue to build upon our strengths, such as mathematics and writing, especially with our youngest children; focus on spelling and continue to shape our curriculum, especially our Early Years.
- Continue to promote outstanding behaviour and attitudes and provide support for those who may find barriers to this.
- Develop pupils' confidence, resilience and knowledge to support mental and physical health and work towards the Healthy School Award.
- Continue to develop our church school ethos in line with the SIAMS framework (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools).

Governors also expressed their congratulations and thanks.

#### **Christmas Productions**

We are looking forward to our Christmas Production next week, with the dress rehearsal today and performances next week. The first performance begins at **2pm on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> December** doors will open at **1.50pm**. The second performance begins at **6pm on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> December**. For the second performance, please bring pupils to their **external classroom door** between **5.30pm and 5.40pm** to get changed into costumes. Parents/carers should then make their way to
