Homework is usually set weekly each Friday and should be returned to school by the following Wednesday. Spellings and times tables need regular practice. Please support your child by hearing them read and signing in their record book; it really does make a difference. Both books should return to school daily.



As careful as we are to cover uniforms during art sessions, it would help us greatly to have some extra painting protection if anyone has old sleeved shirts which could be donated to the class.

Most children have returned to school with full P.E. and games kits. Please note that sessions are on Mondays and those attending Sports Club will need them on Tuesdays. Both indoor and outdoor kits may be needed. As always, indoor shoes are essential too.

For swimming, which will take place on ten consecutive Friday afternoons beginning 13th September, past experience has proved how difficult tights can be when the girls are getting changed. Hair must be tied back and no jewellery worn. Please consider a hair turban for those with longer locks as these can ensure a dry bus journey on colder days. Goggles are useful and should be tightened to fit your child before the first session.
