Dear Parent/Carer,

Happy New Year and welcome to a new school term! It looks set to be a busy one, with lots to do. It is lovely to see the children back in school, refreshed after their Christmas holiday.

#### **Christian Values**

Our work on Christian values this term focuses on 'Perseverance' and 'Service'. These themes will be echoed in collective worship and reinforced through our curriculum. Please see attached our 'Home School Values', which can be used to reinforce this work at home. We explored Epiphany with Reverend Maggie in collective worship this week and we will be finding out more about Shrove Tuesday, Lent, Mothering Sunday, Palm Sunday and Easter this term.

If there are weeks you child cannot attend, please let us know in advance. If we are unable to run the club for any reason we will contact you by letter or text.

#### **Year 6 SATS Booster**

Our **Year 6 Parents' SATs meeting** took place last week, providing lots of information about the forthcoming SATS in May. It was great to see all of our Year 6 children represented. Year 6 pupils have received their own pack of revision books and have made a great start in working through these.

Weekly SATS booster sessions for Year 6 pupils will take place every Thursday after school until SATS week in May. Sessions run from 3.40-4.30pm. Please note the session which would normally run next Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> January has moved to **Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> January** but we do aim to maintain consistent times.

We are joining in the annual bird watch on **Wednesday 22**<sup>nd</sup> **January** (next week). Please ensure your child is dressed in suitable outdoor clothing for the weather as they will be out in the school grounds.
